#### WHAT IS FORT LYTTON?

On a grassy outpost near the mouth of the Brisbane River lies Fort Lytton—the heritage listed remains of Australia's only surviving moated, 19th century fortress and the birthplace of Queensland's military history.

From 1881 until the 1930s, Fort Lytton was Brisbane's front line of defence. In a time of uncertainty and world unrest, the fort was built to protect residents from naval attacks from the French—located just three days sail in Noumea.

Today Fort Lytton National Park is one of Queensland's most important heritage sites.
