


Hatchlings wait for a drop in temperature at the surface of their nest before emerging, as that usually indicates nightfall.







Marine turtles drink seawater, and use special glands to excrete the salt as tears—it doesn't mean they're sad!










Hatchlings use natural light horizons to find their way to the ocean. Help these hatchlings avoid the threats and make it safely to the water!




