

Frequently Asked Questions

Junior Ranger & Wildlife at Night activities

- 1. Do participants need to bring or wear any specific items of clothing?**

Participants must have suitable clothing including a hat and enclosed footwear. Gumboots are ideal for all activities as participants may be getting muddy and wet.
- 2. Can the weather impact delivery of an activity?**

In the event of adverse weather, activities may need to be altered, postponed or cancelled at the discretion of the activity coordinator. We encourage participants to pack a raincoat in case of wet weather.
- 3. Can I join my child on Junior Ranger activities?**

Due to the behind the scenes nature, family and friends are unable to join as observers.
- 4. Do participants need to pay for park admission?**

Park admission is included for some activities. Please check the activity for detail on inclusions.
- 5. Is any food included in the activity?**

Participants are required to provide their own food and drink. During the activity, there is no access to the onsite café. For park visitors and the members of the general public, the Walkabout Creek Café is open 9am to 2:00pm and the Fleay's Cafe is open 9:00am to 4:00pm.
- 6. Can my child leave the activity by themselves?**

All participants are required to be signed in and out of activities by a legal guardian or nominated person holding permission signed by the legal guardian.
- 7. Can I nominate someone to collect my child?**

An *Activity Release Form* is to be completed prior to or at commencement of the activity. On this form you can nominate someone else (18 years or older) to collect the participant.
- 8. What is the minimum age for my child to attend an activity?**

Age restrictions apply to all activities. Please refer to each activity for age specific restrictions.
- 9. My child needs to take some prescribed medicine during the activity, can you administer this?**

All medication required must accompany the participant (i.e. puffer) and remain with the participant. We cannot administer medication. Staff are trained to administer First Aid.
- 10. My child has individual needs, can they participate?**

The department has an inclusive approach to facilitate participation, however the activity coordinator reserves the right to apply additional conditions or decline entry where participants have individual needs (medical or other).
- 11. Can I request that my child is not filmed or photographed during the activity?**

We will only take a photograph or film participants if given permission via the *Activity Release Form*.
- 12. When do I need to collect my child after the activity?**

Participants must be picked up within 15 minutes of the advertised activity end time.
- 13. Who will be leading and delivering the activity?**

Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service Park Rangers will be coordinating and delivering the activity including showing live animals to support important themes such as wildlife conservation.
- 14. Do staff hold Queensland Working with Children Check Blue Cards?**

Park Rangers and Volunteers delivering activities have been issued with a Blue Card for child-related employment.
