Fees to conduct commercial and recreational activities on QPWS managed areas

This Information Sheet details the applicable fees to be paid by applicants and holders of authorities authorising commercial and recreational activities on QPWS managed areas.

Fees applicable as at 1 July 2023

The Department of Environment and Science (DES) reviews its fees and charges annually and applies increases as approved by the chief executive. This information sheet contains the regulatory and non-regulatory fees associated with conducting commercial and recreational activities on Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service (QPWS) managed areas under the:

- Nature Conservation Act 1992
- Forestry Act 1959
- Recreation Areas Management Act 2006.

PLEASE NOTE: Applications cannot be accepted without payment of the relevant application fee. Once paid, application fees are non-refundable.

Definitions

Term	Definition
'Minor Amendment'	means an amendment that –
	a) Omits a condition if the omission does not adversely affect the holders' interests; or
	b) Corrects an error; or
	c) Makes another change, other than a change of substance that does not adversely affect the holder's interests.
	Refer Operational Policy: Amendments and variations to permits for QPWS managed areas
'Variation'	means an alteration to a permit that would result in a change in the nature of the use authorised under the original permit and would require a formal amendment process. Fees associated with a variation will be equivalent to the full application fee (scheduled fee) for a new permit of the same type.
'Daily fee'	means the fee payable for each client '5 years or older' of the holder of the permit, taking part in the activity carried out under the permit, other than an educational tour, or a camp of a type approved by the chief executive. Refer Operational policy: Fee concessions for educational excursions, tours and camps on QPWS managed areas



'Joint marine park authority'	means an instrument that includes more than one of the following - (a) a commercial activity permit; (b) a permission granted under the <i>Marine Parks Act 2004</i> ; (c) a permission granted under the <i>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975</i> (Cth).
'Joint marine park authority permit'	means a commercial activity permit forming a part of a joint marine park authority.
'Prescribed structure'	as defined in Schedule 8 of the Nature Conservation (Protected Areas Management) Regulation 2017 and the Schedule 'Dictionary' of the Recreation Areas Management Act 2006.

Fees for commercial activity permits for filming and photography

NOTE: Filming and Photography activities that involve no more than 10 persons and do not involve the erection, construction or use of a prescribed structure (see definition of 'prescribed structure' page 1) do not require a commercial activity permit.
